## 1. ART OnO 2025 Overview

---

- ART OnO returns to SETEC in Seoul on April 11 with 40 galleries from 20+ countries, with a VIP preview on April 10.
- Following last year's success, a number of galleries are participating in ART OnO again this year, generating considerable anticipation within the art community.
- Around 10 galleries are making their debut at a Korean art fair through ART OnO.
- ART OnO 2025 features an expanded roster of galleries, maintaining strong representation from European and North American galleries while also welcoming a greater number of galleries from Asia, reflecting a broader international scope and deeper engagement with the global art market.
- A wider range of programs will be offered, including Special Exhibitions, Private Collection Booths, Talk Programs, Docent Tours, and Kids Programs.

Returning to SETEC in Seoul from April 11 to 13, ART OnO 2025 captures what it means to be “Young and Fresh, but Classy.” Featuring both emerging talents and established blue-chip artists, the fair celebrates diversity in contemporary art. This year's edition brings together over 40 galleries from more than 20 countries, including major art hubs such as the United States, Germany, United Kingdom, France, and Japan. With an increased number of Asian galleries participating, ART OnO continues to strengthen its position as a key platform for cultural exchange in the region. A VIP preview will be held on April 10.

The second edition of ART OnO is set to build on the success of last year's event, indicated by the significant number of returning galleries returning, signaling strong engagement from the international art community. With returning galleries such as **A-Lounge**, **ARARIO GALLERY**, **Esther Schipper**, **Galerie Zink**, **Gallery Baton**, **Peres Projects**, and **MISAKO & ROSEN**, ART OnO 2025 boasts a high retention rate and growing recognition as a valuable platform for collectors, curators, and art professionals.

In addition, ART OnO 2025 welcomes around 10 galleries making their debut at a Korean art fair. This year's fair also features more Asian galleries than in 2024, further fostering cross-cultural dialogue within Korean art scene.

ART OnO 2025 features a diverse roster of both established and emerging galleries. Among this year's newcomers are **MASSIMODECARLO**, **Tomio Koyama Gallery**, **Kaikai Kiki Gallery**, **NINO MIER Gallery**, and **Galerie Sultana**.

**MASSIMODECARLO**, a renowned Italian contemporary art gallery, showcases internationally acclaimed artists such as Paola Pivi, John McAllister, and Mark Yang. The gallery is known for its commitment to fostering innovative contemporary artists and creating exhibitions that resonate globally.

**Tomio Koyama Gallery** brings a dynamic selection of artists from Japanese contemporary art icons like Yoko Ono and Kishio Suga to internationally acclaimed names like Tom Sachs. Additionally, the

gallery features works by rising talents such as Makiko Kudo and Rika Minamitani, whose distinct artistic voices are gaining interest worldwide.

**Kaikai Kiki Gallery**, founded by Takashi Murakami, continues to push the boundaries of contemporary art by blending fine art with pop culture. Specializing in discovering and supporting emerging artists, the gallery plays a pivotal role in shaping Japan's dynamic art scene, while bridging the gap between traditional art practices and contemporary cultural movements through experimental exhibitions. Kaikai Kiki Gallery makes its Korean art fair debut at ART OnO 2025.

**NINO MIER Gallery**, with locations in New York and Brussels, presents a cutting-edge program featuring artists such as Nicola Tyson, Jansson Stegner, Ethan Cook, and Debora Druick. With its first entry into the Korean art market at ART OnO 2025, the gallery introduces its distinctive curatorial vision and dedication to highlighting contemporary painters and sculptors who challenge artistic conventions through unique stylistic approaches.

**Galerie Sultana**, based in Paris, creates an immersive exhibition space reminiscent of a "candy store," designed to make contemporary art more approachable. Their booth features works by Sophie Varin, known for her small-scale paintings, alongside sculptural pieces by Justin Fitzpatrick, whose work challenges traditional notions of materiality and form.

This year, ART OnO also serves as a gateway for several international galleries making their first appearance in Korea. Along with Kaikai Kiki Gallery and NINO MIER Gallery (mentioned above), **AISHO**, **Artemin Gallery**, **CON\_**, **CHAUFFEUR**, and **NIKA Project Space** also take part in their first Korean art fair. This marks a significant step for ART OnO as it continues to serve as a crucial hub linking the Korean art scene to the global stage.

Founded in Tokyo in 2022, **CON\_** integrates contemporary art with urban culture by presenting exhibitions that reimagine artistic creation in a modern, city-oriented context. Meanwhile, Taipei-based **Artemin Gallery** explores the intersection of neuroscience and artistic expression, focusing on works that reflect sensory perception and emotional responses.

Other notable participants include **AISHO**, a Hong Kong-based gallery with strong ties to Japanese contemporary art, which curates interdisciplinary projects that bridge East Asian and global art markets. **EUKARYOTE**, founded in Tokyo's Jingumae district in 2018, is committed to supporting emerging artists whose work carries long-term significance in contemporary art history, offering a platform for experimental and boundary-pushing exhibitions.

**CHAUFFEUR**, headquartered in Sydney, specializes in representing Australian and New Zealand artists on the global stage. In 2025, the gallery is set to expand its reach by opening a new space in Lisbon, further strengthening its presence in the European art market.

The inclusion of these new participants underscores ART OnO's role as a bridge between Korea's art market with the broader global stage. The fair continues to cultivate an environment where collectors and audiences can engage with leading galleries and discover emerging talents from around the world.

ART OnO goes beyond a traditional exhibition, conducting a range of programs that allow visitors to engage with contemporary art on a deeper level.

The Docent Program offers guided tours led by professional educators who provide in-depth insights into key works and the artistic methodologies behind them. Through these sessions, visitors gain a richer understanding of artworks at ART OnO and explore various perspectives and approaches within contemporary art.

In collaboration with Joy Museum, the Kids Program is a hands-on educational experience designed to introduce children to contemporary art in a fun and accessible way. This program includes guided tours with experienced educators, interactive activities such as creating personalized collection books, and hands-on experiences that explore contemporary art techniques. By partnering with Joy Museum, a leader in children's art education, ART OnO ensures that young participants can naturally develop their artistic sensibilities in an engaging environment.

Following the success of last year's edition, the ART OnO Talk Program returns as a platform for exploring intersections of contemporary art and architecture, fashion, culture, and other fields. While centered on art, the discussions extend beyond traditional boundaries, examining how art connects with and evolves alongside contemporary society. Topics range from contemporary art trends and the art market to the creative process, offering audiences a fresh perspective on art through insightful discussions. Further details on speakers and program structure will be announced soon.

ART OnO 2025 takes place from April 11 to April 13 at SETEC in Seoul. More details can be found on the official website.

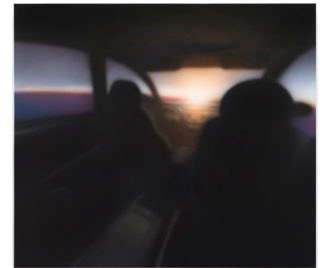

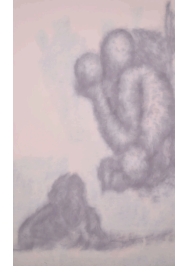

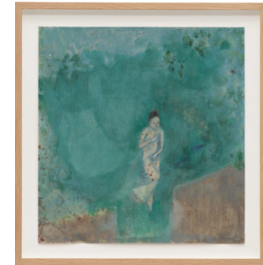
